## ADVENT







In Pre-School we have been learning all about Advent and getting ready for Christmas. We learnt that the word Advent means coming. It is a time of waiting and preparation. We each painted our hand to make a print and then cut it out to make the leaves around the wreath. We needed 5 candles on our Advent wreath. This is because there is one candle for each Sunday in Advent and an extra candle for Christmas day! As we light the candles, we are preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus who is the 'light' of the world.

I am putting paint on my hand to make a green leaf for the Advent wreath. The paint is cold and feels funny.



We have to cut out the handprints.

Then we can put our hands together and pray to God and Jesus. During this topic of Advent, Year 3 have been learning about the story of the Annunciation. This is when the Angel Gabriel visited Mary in Nazareth, to announce she would have the baby Jesus. The children drew a concept map about this event and also had the opportunity to hot-seat Mary (asking her questions about this event). Year 3 then read about the Visitation, which is when Mary visited her cousin Elizabeth in the Judean hills.

Year 3 had the privilege of Father Matthew visiting both classes. Father Matthew read a story from the Old Testament, so the children could complete more pictures for their class Jesse Tree. Father Matthew read the story of 'Daniel in the Den of Lions' to 3G and then read the story of 'Moses in the Bulrushes' to 3Y.

The classes have completed this topic by learning about the Medieval tradition of the Jesse Tree and how, in many ways, it was an old form of an Advent Calendar.
