Welcome to the second RE Newsletter of our new academic year. We hope you find it a helpful way informing you about your child's RE lessons.

Year 1 have been learning about the Liturgical Calendar and the qualities of a Saint. Miss Ollivro visited each class to teach the children about the Rosary.



Year 1 have also learnt about Saint David, the Patron Saint of Wales. The children created a 'Wanted Poster' for a Saint, where they thought about the qualities a saint would need.



Coming soon...

Advent begins on Sunday 29th November. This year it will feel very different with local churches only open for a limited number of people. The FCJ staff will be sharing a daily reflection throughout Advent on our Twitter feed. We are encouraging families to take a few moments to watch each daily reflection. We will also be holding a very special Advent day in school during December.

The main themes within the Advent (November-December) topic are:

- YR –Advent as a special time when we get ready for the birth of Jesus.
- Y1 Learning about getting ready for the birth of Jesus through the eyes of Mary and Joseph.
- Y2 Learning about the symbolism that helps us get ready to meet Jesus.
- Y3 –Advent as a time when we recognise Jesus in the world.
- Y4 The First Coming of Jesus is placed in historical context
- Y5 The coming of Jesus, connected to the promise in the Old Testament.
- Y 6 –Advent through parables, prayers and hymns of the Church.

Year 4 have been thoroughly enjoying the 'Prayers, Saints and Feasts' topic. They have been thinking in depth about how, when and why we pray. They have been using their Collective Worship time to demonstrate the different ways they have learnt to pray.



The children have explored the Lord's Prayer to understand the meaning of the words and how this special prayer can guide them in their own lives. They also made videos to demonstrate how we pray the Rosary.

Bishop Philip invites you to join him as he journeys through Advent this year, by having an Advent Wreath in your home. He asks that you pray around it each evening using the prayers, songs and scripture found in the Diocesan Advent Booklet.

The Bishop has made a film explaining the traditions and symbolism associated with Advent Wreaths. The Advent Booklet contains prayers, scripture readings, YouTube clips and a song for each day of Advent.

Keza explained that she has been looking forward to this for a long time, especially after seeing her older sibling being able to serve. Imogen expressed, "I love school very much and I love God, so I see this as a really big opportunity". Charlie and Louis spoke of being happy and excited to learn more about the experience and were looking forward to their new role. Darcie said, "I see it as a real privilege to grow closer to God." Rois was able to explain how Miss Ollivro will be able to help the altar servers, and that she is looking forward to serving both at school and in her own church.



Jacob, one of our current Year 6 Altar Servers, has spoken of his time altar serving last year: "At FCJ we have a group of altar servers. We help the priest during the school Masses. It feels like we are the angels of God helping at the altar. Miss Ollivro is a kind and generous person who helps us learn what to do. Even though we are a big team from different year groups, we feel God's power as we work together."
