REVELATION JANUARY-FEBRUARY 2022





Samuel may have felt amazed when he realised he was being called by God. He may have felt surprised when God spoke to him.

Year 3 have been learning about the story of Samuel within the unit of 'Revelation'. The children have considered the difference between 'hearing' and 'listening' and have thought how they can ready for God's call. Samuel's story inspired some reflective acrostic poems, considering how Samuel responded to God's call. The photos here show the children completing an 'affinity diagram' about the story, identifying the actions, words and responses throughout the scripture. We were so grateful to Father Matthew who visited us this week to talk about the importance of the Liturgy of the Word, and how there are references throughout the Bible to people responding to God's call. Our pupils really enjoyed creating their own book jackets depicting these stories. Throughout this unit, the Year 3 pupils have been reflecting on the big question: 'Does God still call people today, and how do they respond?'.



In Year 2, the children focused on learning about the Miracles and Parables of Jesus.

They explored different stories and used role play to deepen their understanding of how the characters felt at different points of each miracle studied.

Through these stories the children learnt about God's love for us all.

Jesus is putting the fish and bread in the sky. He is asking God to bless it and make more. The main themes within the **Lent** topic are:

Year R –Lent as a time when we get ready for Easter.

Year 1 – The basic meaning of Lent with links to the life and teachings of Jesus.

Year 2 –Lent as being preparation for Easter, commencing with Ash Wednesday and being a time of seeking forgiveness and doing penance.

Year 3 – How Jesus changed the people he met and deepened his relationship with the Father through prayer.

Year 4 –Jesus' time in the wilderness. This unit also explores how prayer, fasting, almsgiving and living out the Beatitudes help us prepare for Easter.

Year 5 – The concept of temptation and how preparation for Easter involves becoming more like Jesus through St Paul's teaching.

Year 6 – The teachings of Jesus through key scripture including the parable of the rich man, the story of Lazarus and the account of the Samaritan woman at the well.

FCJ Advent Acts of Kindness

Each week follows a different thread through the many stories of justice in the Bible to explore how God brings justice, wholeness and salvation to all.
