Maritime Museum Trip

In Year 1 we have been learning about our local history. To mark the end of this topic, we visited the Maritime Museum to explore stories of the sea. We studied how the wind and weather affects the sea. During our visit, we got to see how waves are created and the stormy conditions that explorers must have experienced during some of their expeditions.



We saw models of famous ships and how they had changed and developed over the years. We investigated what makes a ship sail and how to navigate one. We got to go on a ship and explore the different parts of a boat. It was a superb day, full of new learning and interactive activities



Year 2 have been learning about Sacraments, in particular the Sacrament of Baptism. They have learnt about the Baptism of Jesus and what happens in Baptism Ceremonies. The children then re-enacted this Sacrament, remembering carefully what to say and do.
