Speak Dog





Year 1 had a visit from Rosie, a clinical animal behaviourist. She brought Spud and Dotty with her to teach us how to 'speak dog and stay safe'. We learnt that we must ask the dog's owner before stroking a dog and that we must not approach a dog if they are eating, showing their teeth or the whites of their eyes. Rosie shared lots of important information for us to remember.

Clinical Animal Behaviourists

Clinical Animal Behaviourists help the owners of animals such as dogs, cats, horses, rabbits, and birds resolve behavioural problems through diagnosis of the problem behaviour and application of an individual behaviour modification programme.





Australia Day

Year 2 took part in an Australia Day to launch their new creative topic. Mr and Mrs Firth came in to school to tell the children a whole variety of facts about Australia.



The children tasted Anzac biscuits and learnt why they are very special to the people of Australia and New Zealand. The children enjoyed creating their own stories using aboriginal markings.

Lindy Hop

Year 3 had a wonderful time celebrating Liberation Day on Friday 10th May. Our P.E lesson was an opportunity to learn a dance very popular during World War 2 called the 'Lindy Hop'. We had a beautiful morning outside practising together with music playing over the loud speakers.

Lindy Hop developed as a partner dance from the Charleston and the Breakaway in the late 1920s and had its heyday during the 1930s and 40s particularly in the Savoy Ballroom in Harlem. It became very popular and then evolved into all of the other dances during World War 2.





Creative Writing



Year 4 have been creating some imaginative unaided pieces of writing during English. They have been focusing on different ways of getting to school. They have thought about how they can use description and time conjunctions to make their writing more exciting. The children have then been editing and re-drafting their work linking to feedback given by the teacher. They have published their work, ready for display, using their best handwriting.



Conjunctions: Time

Year 5 recently spent the day at Fort Regent, taking part in the Primary Sports Festival. The children had the opportunity to take part in a variety of fitness and athletics-based activities, all the while earning points for their class! WhatsApp Hack

WhatsApp (16+) users have been advised to update their app, following a hack which enabled cybercriminals to remotely install surveillance software on phones and other devices on which it is downloaded.

A fix was issued on Friday 17th May, and we advise all parents and carers who use the app to update WhatsApp, which can be done quickly and easily in the app store for their devices. The fix is contained within the update.



Jumbo Privacy App

If you use a lot of apps on your phone, setting up and checking all the privacy settings can be a chore, particularly Facebook which has about 40 different settings!

Jumbo, which is now available on iOS (an Android version is forthcoming) Is an app which manages your privacy on four different services: Twitter, Facebook, Google search, and Amazon's Alexa. In the future, Jumbo plans to manage your privacy on Instagram and Tinder as well.



YOLO App - another anonymous question-asking app doing the rounds.

YOLO uses Snapchat for login and lets you add an "ask me anything" sticker to your Snapchat Story.

You can also use this without Snapchat as a standalone app for anonymous messaging.

YOLO is vulnerable to being used to spread hate speech and bullying.

This app is only on iOS at the moment and is rated 17+ and we would recomend that you do not let young children use it.
