## The Story of Helen Keller

In assembly, Ms Lenzi taught the children about the truly inspirational life story of Helen Keller. At just nineteen months old, Helen became extremely ill, and lost her sight, hearing and speech. Despite these devastating setbacks, Helen was amazingly resilient, and with the steadfast support of teacher, and lifelong companion Anne Sullivan, learnt to spell and communicate her very first word 'doll' using finger spelling. Helen proved to be an outstanding student and quickly progressed to learning braille. She achieved great accolades throughout her life, but her greatest regret, was that she never learnt to speak more coherently; she always felt she could have 'done more good' if she had. Ask your child what they remember from the story of Helen Keller. The photos show Helen as a young girl, with Anne Sullivan, holding her favourite doll, and in later life.

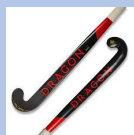

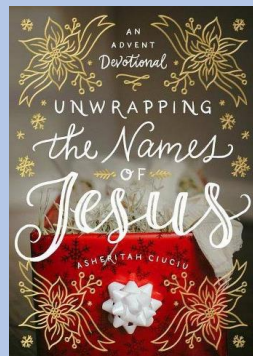
On Wednesday, some of the members of the Charity Committee visited the St Vincent De Paul Food Bank. The children delivered the food from our Reverse Advent Calendar.
